You can use the opportunity to present results or simply seek input depending on the stage of your project. The Three Minute Thesis category is perhaps best known as a competition, however for Conference it is not a competition, but rather an opportunity to present your work.

Please note that in 2020, the Conference Committee will not be calling for written papers or posters.

Three Minute Thesis Policy

All Authors who present or submit a Three Minute Thesis presentation for consideration in the Australian Cotton Conference will be required to comply with our Conference Proceedings Policy as follows:

With the acceptance of the Three Minute Thesis presentation for inclusion in the 2020 Australian Cotton Conference Proceedings, the Authors agree that the 2020 Australian Cotton Conference has permission to:

- a) Publish, reproduce, distribute, display and store the presentation in all forms, formats and media whether now known or developed (including print, digital and electronic forms) at the Conference and on the Conference website.
- b) Allow the presentation to be utilised as a reference source via the Cotton Research & Development Corporation's digital online repository, Inside Cotton.

The Authors warrant and certify that:

- a) The Authors are the sole authors of the presentation. If the materials of other authors are used, the Authors have obtained the permission of the owners of the copyright in all such materials to enable them to grant the rights contained herein.
- b) Publication of the presentation will not breach Copyright owned by another organisation or individual person.
- c) All of the facts contained in the presentation are true and accurate.
- d) The Author who has signed this Agreement has full right, power and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of all of the Authors. All the listed Authors have agreed to be listed Authors, and have granted the signing Author the Authority to enter into this agreement on their behalf.
